Department of Health and Wellness Overview

The Prince Edward Island Department of Health and Wellness serves and supports all Islanders. In accordance with the *Health Services Act*, the Department supports the Minister of Health and Wellness in providing oversight of health services in the province and establishing accountability mechanisms, standards for health services, performance targets, and policies and guidelines for the management and delivery of services. It also provides leadership in matters related to public health and health promotion and establishes policy direction to improve the health and well-being of citizens of PEI. It works to ensure alignment of priorities between the Department of Health and Wellness and Health PEI, which is critical for ensuring that both organizations work together effectively to create measurable progress on enhancing the health and well-being of Islanders.



Mandate

The mandate of the Department of Health and Wellness is to provide leadership, policy direction and programs that contribute to:

- health protection and promotion for islanders; and
- quality and sustainable health services that are accessible to Islanders.

The Department fulfills this mandate in partnership with Islanders and communities, Health PEI, health professions and allied health professionals, non-government and community organizations, the private sector, and other government departments.



Highlights and Accomplishments

Expenditures

• In 2019-2020, the Department of Health and Wellness **operating budget was \$35.8 million**, up from \$33.2 million in 2018-2019.

Planning and Policy Development

- The Government of PEI added prescription medications to the provincial drug formulary to improve access to critical medication for patients with arthritis, diabetes, COPD, lung cancer, heart failure, and those receiving radiation therapy.
- The Government of PEI cancelled a planned increase to the self-pay accommodation rate and announced that it was **establishing one consistent accommodation rate for all people living in public long-term care or community-care facilities**. Cancelling this increase reduces the cost for Island residents living in public facilities and creates a fair and equitable price for all residence in public facilities. A more transparent and fair accommodation rate will help ensure that all Island residents has access to high quality long-term care.
- The Province of PEI and the Medical Society of PEI signed an agreement to move forward on a **physicians' recruiting physicians model for PEI**. The Medical Society of PEI will work closely with the Department of Health and Wellness and Health PEI to develop the new recruitment model and will assess the best recruitment practices across Canada and internationally, while also seeking input from PEI physicians and hosting a facilitated workshop with stakeholders.
- The Government of PEI made **changes to the long-term care subsidy assessment process** that allows a spouse whose partner is living in long-term care to keep either half of their family income or a new minimum amount of \$22,133. These changes will help spouses of long-term care residents retain more of their family income and stay in their own homes and communities.

Population Health

The Government of PEI launched an initiative during the month of November, in conjunction with Diabetes Awareness Month, that gives Islanders **access to free diabetes risk assessment clinics** in Souris, Montague, Charlottetown, Cornwall, North Rustico, Summerside, Miscouche, Lennox Island, and O'Leary. The clinics focus on early diagnosis and treatment of diabetes and helps

Islanders with diabetes a chance to allow for earlier management which will help reduce the risk of complications from diabetes.

- The Department of Health and Wellness announced that **spouses of long-term** care residents will be able to stay in their own homes and communities longer with updates to long-term care regulations that will allow them to retain more of their family income.
- The Government of PEI added an additional funding stream to the Wellness Grant Program that made accessing the funds more accessible for community groups. The two funding streams are the **Community Catalyst Grant**, **and the Health Promotion Impact Grant**. The program provided funding to 23 community groups for initiatives in the priority areas of: living tobacco free; being physically active and reducing sedentary time; healthy eating; consuming alcohol responsibly; and mental health promotion.

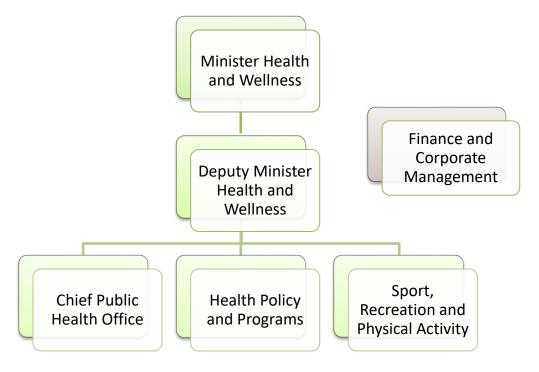
Encouraging Healthy and Active Lives

 The Department of Health and Wellness contributed \$125,000 to the Canadian Red Cross to support water safety program day camps across the province. These programs began on PEI in 1946 and teach kids life-saving swimming and boating safety skills while promoting an active and healthy lifestyle.

COVID-19

- With the emergence of the global COVID-19 pandemic, and the first reported case of COVID-19 in PEI on March 14, 2020, the Government of PEI took steps to protect the health and safety of Islanders during a rapidly evolving situation. The Chief Public Health Office put in place measures to limit the spread of COVID-19 on PEI and led the:
 - activation of provincial pandemic response plan, including regular briefings and integration with government, CPHO, and Health PEI operations;
 - o participation in national response according to the Federal, Provincial, and Territorial Public Health Response Plan for Biological Events;
 - o issuance of guidance on public health measures;
 - o issuance of guidance on the emerging COVID-19 pathogen;
 - o developing policies for COVID-19 testing; and
 - o response to concerns from organizations, community groups, business and industry, and members of the public.

Organizational Structure



Finance and Corporate Management

This Division supports and assists the Department of Health and Wellness in the areas of human resource management and financial management.

Chief Public Health Office

Public health is defined as the organized efforts of society to keep people healthy and prevent injury, illness, and premature death. It is the combination of programs, services, and policies that protect and promote health.

The mandate of the Chief Public Health Office (CPHO) is to protect and promote the health of Islanders through leadership, partnership, and excellence in public health. The division is responsible for delivery of health protection programs including food safety as legislated under the *Public Health Act*. This is accomplished through regulation, inspection, and enforcement. The CPHO is responsible for preventive measures to reduce the spread of diseases including immunization and communicable disease infection control. The CPHO also monitors provincial health trends to help inform program development and public health policy.

Sport, Recreation and Physical Activity Division

This division is responsible for encouraging Islanders to be active through sport, recreation, and other physical activity. This mandate is achieved through a wide variety of partnerships with sport, recreation, and active living organizations throughout the province. The division provides grants and consultation services to a number of provincial, regional, and community groups and works with a variety of provincial and federal government departments and organizations, as well as national and interprovincial non-governmental organizations.

Programs supported by this division include the Amateur Sport Program, Community Recreation Support Program, and go!PEI.

Health Policy and Programs

This division provides policy and planning direction in various aspects of health care delivery. In turn, these supports assist the Minister in providing leadership, strategic direction, and oversight of the health care system. The division is also responsible for health workforce planning through the actions of the Recruitment and Retention Secretariat
